Are You Happy?

As the apostle Paul made his defense before King Agrippa he said, "I think myself happy" (Acts 26:2). In Paul's letter to the Philippians, we see repeated use of the words joy, gladness and rejoice. In fact, this epistle is thought by some to be the greatest treatise on happiness because it addresses things that will and will not bring happiness. Now, with that said, let me ask two very important questions: "Are you happy?" and "Do others see you as a happy person?"

In Philippians we notice somethings that will NOT bring us happiness. Possessions will not bring us happiness. This epistle of joy was written when Paul was in prison and possessed little to nothing. Yet, despite the circumstances, Paul was happy. Popularity will not make us happy. When we read Philippians 1:15-18 we see that Paul was not a very popular person. Some were jealous of his accomplishments, however, his amazing attitude was "Christ is preached; and I therein do rejoice, yea, and will rejoice" (Philippians 1:18). Today, people forfeit their integrity, purity and even their identity to gain popularity, and yet they find no happiness. Finally, a problem free life will not bring happiness. In Philippians 4:10-12 Paul states that learned to be happy regardless of his circumstances. When life was difficult Paul was happy because he learned that happiness is a state of mind, it is a chosen way of life (Philippians 4:6-8).

Now let us notice some things that WILL bring us happiness. First, faith in God will bring us happiness (Philippians 1:24-25). Our faith is to be characterized by love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness and faith (Galatians 5:22). We cannot experience true joy without faith (Hebrews 11:6). Paul said, "Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing" (Romans 15:13). As a Christian, if you feel that you are not experiencing the fullness of joy, try spending some serious time in prayer and in God's word. These two things will increase your faith, which will bring you joy in the Lord (Romans 10:17; James 5:16; 1 Peter 3:12). Secondly, fellowship and unity will bring us joy, (Philippians 2:1-5). The unity of believers is something Jesus prayed for (John 17:20-21). God wants His children to be likeminded because He knows that unity promotes fellowship and fellowship makes the Christian life joyful. The Psalmist declares, "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity!" (Psalm 133:1). A lack of unity among Christians is a sure way to destroy happiness. Strive to be likeminded with other Christians and you will find great happiness in your life.

Finally, our Christian family can be a source of joy. In Philippians 4:1 Paul refers to the brethren at Philippi as the "dearly beloved" (Philippians 4:1). The church is a family and it should bring joy to our hearts to have a spiritual family to lean upon when we are discouraged or when we are struggling (1 Timothy 3:15). If your life lacks joy, try building fellowship with other believers by attending worship services regularly, participating in fellowship events and other activities of the church and spending quality time with other Christians outside of worship services. This type of fellowship will banish loneliness and bring happiness.

If you want to be happy the book of Philippians gives you the road to travel. Have faith in God and His word, be born again to become part of the Christian family, be like minded, and you will find great happiness.
