Scientists tell us that the outside of our ears catch up to 73,700 vibrations a second. And yet, for all the wonders of our God-given ability to hear, we still have great difficulty listening. As we all know, any healthy relationship is built around good communication. YBC Camp News


We have camp scholarships available for our kids. There is a list of items needed for the first camp in June. It is on the table in the foyer.

Someone said her husband had just purchased a beautiful new automatic dishwasher for her birthday in addition to a very nice dinner for two at her favorite restaurant. Molly said she had the oldest car in the neighborhood, the oldest clothes dryer, oldest refrigerator, and oldest dishwasher. Wait a second Dillard said. What do you mean you have the oldest dishwasher, I wash the dishes in case you forgot! Molly had that funny little smirk on her face when she said; "that proves my point, just like I said I have the oldest dishwasher in the neighborhood". Dillard laughed as hard as everyone else at Molly's quick wit before he said: well at least I am good or something and not useless like some old worn out appliance. Molly looked at Dillard with the usual affectionate smile she has for him and said; "no dear, you are far from useless. I don't know of anyone that is more diligent serving the Lord by serving others than you!"

Molly continued to speak. She said no one is useless, God has a plan for every one of us.
