Charles H. Spurgeon once said: "After preaching the gospel for forty years, and after printing the sermons I have preached for more than thirty and six years; reaching now to the number of 22,000 in weekly succession, I am fairly entitled to speak about the fullness and richness of the Bible as the preacher's book.

Brethren, it is inexhaustible. No question about freshness will arise if we keep close to the text of the sacred volume. There can be no difficulty about finding themes totally distinct from those we have handled before; the variety is as infinite as the fullness. A long life will only suffice to skirt the shores of this continent of light. In the 40 years of my ministry I have only touched the hem of the garment of divine truth; but what virtue has flowed out of it. The word is like it's author – infinite, immeasurable and without end. If you were ordained to be a preacher though eternity, you would have before you a theme equal to everlasting demands."

TRUST IN THE LORD

³⁷The next day, when they came down from the mountain, a large crowd met him. ³⁸ A man in the crowd called out, "Teacher, I beg you to look at my son, for he is my only child. ³⁹ A spirit seizes him and he suddenly screams; it throws him into convulsions so that he foams at the mouth. It scarcely ever leaves him and is destroying him. ⁴⁰ I begged your disciples to drive it out, but they could not."

⁴¹ "You unbelieving and perverse generation," Jesus replied, "how long shall I stay with you and put up with you? Bring your son here."

⁴² Even while the boy was coming, the demon threw him to the ground in a convulsion. But Jesus rebuked the impure spirit, healed the boy and gave him back to his father. ⁴³ And they were all amazed at the greatness of God. Luke 9:37-43

An incident following the Transfiguration of Christ shows us the importance of faith. A man brought his son to Jesus to be healed, and his disciples were unable to cast the demon out of the young man. When Jesus reached the scene his heart was broken by the weakness of faith shown by all who were present.

The scribes and His enemies who were perpetually faithless, whose heard hearts made it impossible for them to realize the truth. The father of the boy, who had some faith in Christ, but doubted the ability of his apostles. Even His apostles who did not have the faith required to perform the exorcism. All of this faithlessness caused our lord to exclaim "You unbelieving and perverted generation..." Even without the faith of those present Christ showed kindness to the young man and immediately casted the demon out.

But what hindered the young man from being healed by the apostles in the first place? Christ told the apostles that it was the "littleness of your faith" that caused them to fail. Most commentators agree that instead of relying on the power of God that Christ blessed them with, they were relying on their own strengths and self perceived power. This can be a terrible mistake for any Christian to make.

Paul wrote that "we would not trust in ourselves, but in God" (2 Cor. 1.9). Long before Paul wrote that, David said, "Offer the sacrifices of righteousness, and TRUST IN THE LORD" (PS. 4.5). Solomon echoed this sentiment: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and do not lean on your own understanding" (Prov. 3.5).

As prideful humans we do not want to admit that there are just some things that we cannot do. As Christians we must be able to eliminate this pride and realize that if we fully rely on God, trust His will and abilities, we can overcome life's most difficult situations. As David Roper wrote, "a true disciple acknowledges his own shortcomings (Rom. 3.10) and they trust in the Lord with all their strength"
