

Make the Most of the Opportunity

America has long been known as the "land of opportunity." Opportunity has great potential as a motivational force in our lives. In the business realm, when "opportunity knocks", the successful entrepreneur makes the most of it. However, it is commonly admitted that, in the spiritual realm, many opportunities come and go without notice. While human weakness is largely to blame, much of our unused potential can be attributed to a growing complacency toward our God-given mission of seeking and saving the lost. Here are some suggestions to help us make greater use of our spiritual opportunities: 1. Pray for opportunities. God answers prayer. As we use the opportunities God provides, He will grant us even greater opportunities (Mt. 25:29).2. Look for opportunities. While God gives the opportunity, we must recognize it. He is not going to speak directly from heaven, saying, "This is it! This the one you've been waiting for!" When searching for employment, one cannot expect to get a job without looking for one. Similarly, we must prayerfully search for opportunities. As a general rule, they will not simply drop into our laps. 3. Use the opportunity. Once the opportunity presents itself, be ready to use it. Be prepared for the Master's service. In all things, "Conduct yourselves with wisdom toward outsiders, making the most of the opportunity" (Col. 4:5). Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity.

Lead, Follow, Get Out of the Way

Lee laacoca used the above words many years ago in a T.V. commercial about Chrysler products. He said that in the car business one had to lead, follow or get out of the way. Many picked up on that phrase and it has been used in training for organizational leaders ever since. In many ways the statement is true. I, however, would like to put a different twist on it. As Christians it is not either do one or the other. We must, in some respect, do all three.

Lead

Christian's must lead. They must lead through example. Jesus instructs us to be salt and light (Matt. 5:14-16). He states that A city set on a hill cannot be hid. Our lights must shine so that others may see Christ in us and be drawn to Him. It is true that for one to come to Christ, he must be taught. The seed of the Word of God must be sown in his heart, but much work can be done on the soil through a good Christian example.

Christians must also lead through active teaching. We have been given a ministry and a Word of reconciliation (2 Cor. 5:17-21). If you are one of the "us" that has been reconciled, then you are also one of the "us" that has been given a Word and ministry of reconciliation.

Follow

Christians must also follow. First, we must be followers of God (Eph. 5:1-2). One follows God by following His teaching revealed in the Bible. Many claim to be following God, yet rarely open His Book to learn God's will. We must also follow Christ's teaching and example. Jesus said "I have given you an example that you should do as I have done..." (John 13:14-15). He said this in connection with showing humility. Have we become "foot washers" for Jesus? Have we humbled ourselves in service to others, thereby following his example? We also need to be followers of the apostle's teaching and example. Paul said "be followers of me as I also am of Christ." (1 Cor 1:11).

Get Out of the Way

Finally, one must get out of the way. We must get out of the way of the Gospel. There are those who are trying to save others by anything but that one thing which has the power to save... the Gospel (Rom. 1:16, 1 Cor. 1:17-24). People are saved when they hear, believe, and obey the Word of God. Fellowship and friendliness are good and necessary, but they, by themselves, save no one. We must do the hard work of teaching.

We must also get out of the way of those who are trying to do God's work. Some will hinder others because their zeal and enthusiasm makes their own decades of laziness look bad. Many good works have never gotten off the ground or seen the light of day because it's possible or likely success intimidates those who are content with the lethargic status-quo.

Often, for the Christian, we don't choose one of the three, but rather we must lead AND follow AND get out of the way.
