When I Survey the Wondrous Cross

Isaac Watts, who lived from 1674 to 1749 continues to influence Christians worship over 250 years after his death. During his lifetime he wrote approximately 600 hymns, many of which are still used in worship today. In 1707, he wrote "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross." The words to the second verse are: "Forbid it Lord that I should boast, save in the death of Christ my Lord. All the vain things that charm me most, I sacrifice them to His blood." This thought is surely based on the apostle Paul's affirmation in Galatians 6:14, "But God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. "When we reflect on (survey) the cross, we should truly be amazed and humbled. When we survey the cross we see the reality of sin, for if it were not for mankind's sin, the death of Jesus would not have been necessary. We also see the high cost of redemption. To redeem us required the death of the Son of God! The cost of redemption reminds us of how serious sin truly is. When we survey the cross we are reminded that the price for our redemption has been paid. Because of the cross we have been spared from condemnation. When we survey the cross we are told in no uncertain terms that God loves us. As unbelievable as it may seem, He really loves us. May we, like Paul, determine to glory only in the cross of Jesus.

Good Spiritual Vision

In spite of all our advancements, we have never come close to duplicating the marvels found in the human body. Consider the eye. It has the ability to distinguish colors and various shades of life. It has the ability to focus on objects close at hand or far away. It automatically adjusts for light, either reducing the glare or adjusting low-light conditions. The psalmist was correct when he said that we are "fearfully and wonderfully made" (Ps. 139:14).

The eye also possesses tremendous spiritual significance. Jesus said, "The lamp of the body is the eye; if therefore your eye is clear, your whole body will be full of light. But if your eye is

bad, your whole body will be full of darkness. If therefore the light that is in you is darkness, how great is the darkness!" (Mt. 6:22).

Christians must maintain good spiritual vision. Without it, hope vanishes and we will abide in darkness. But Jesus came as "the Sunrise from on high...to shine upon those who sit in darkness and the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace" (Lk. 1:78-79).

The first requirement for good spiritual vision is the acknowledgement that there is a truth to be understood. "The lamp of the body is the eye..." (Mt. 6:22). The eye is the receptacle through which light enters the body. When the eye functions properly, we are able to avoid needless injury.

But, Jesus had more in mind than physical vision. He often used eyesight as an analogy for perception and understanding. He commended His disciples, saying, "blessed are your eyes, because they see; and your ears, because they hear" (Mt. 13:16). Jesus had just explained that His reason for speaking in parables was because some could see but not see and hear but not understand (vs. 13). The eye, then, represents our capacity to understand and receive guidance.

In preaching the truth, we seek to open eyes to the glory of Christ (cf. Acts 26:18). Obeying the gospel is an "eye-opening" experience. In fact, early Christians were sometimes referred to as those who had been enlightened (Hb. 6:4). The opening chapter of the gospel of John describes Jesus as "the true light which, coming into the world, enlightens every man" (Jn. 1:9). We, too, seek to be a light to the world, glorifying God in the things we do (Mt. 5:14, 16). In this way, we may open another's eyes to the glory of God.

Security

We live in a world that is both obsessed with security and at the same time frustrated by the realization that true security is becoming increasingly elusive. Security cameras are everywhere. New, high-tech, super sophisticated weapons systems are continually being incorporated into the defensive systems of nations all around the world in an effort to insure their security from outside attack. But as soon as a new weapons system is deployed, it is already virtually out of date. A newer, more sophisticated, better system designed to defeat the first is either in the developmental process or, in many cases, ready to come on line.

One of the most critical areas of security for any nation is its economic system. Nations operate on economics. When a nation develops economic problems of one sort or another, it usually has an effect on the citizens of that country. Unemployment rates can rise significantly, which further impacts that nation's economy. If a nation's economy is perceived to be insecure by other nations with which it does business, then that nation is automatically weakened globally. Thus, governments go to great lengths to insure the security of their economy.

Hundreds of billions of dollars are spent on software designed to make computers secure against would-be hackers. But any security system that can be designed can be beaten by other designers. In a world that is so tied together by computers, nothing is hack proof. The evidence of this truth is reported in the news with alarming regularity. Identity theft is just one aspect of this much larger problem.

People look to the wrong sources for real security. Simply put, this world is not a secure place. Nations rise, and nations fall. Economies rise and crumble. Companies that offered security for their employees for decades suddenly get bought out, downsized, relocated or go bankrupt. People work for forty years, make seemingly wise investment decisions only to lose huge portions of their savings due to economic upheaval. It happens on a regular basis.

As trite as it may sound to some, real security can only be found in a right relationship with God. Ultimate security simply cannot be found in what this world has to offer. Scripture speaks of "an anchor of the soul." That anchor is the "hope" of eternal life with God in Heaven (Hebrews 6:19). That hope is not just a desire; it is also an expectation. Those whose lives are anchored in that hope experience the "peace of God, which...will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:7).

God is described as "the God of hope" (Rom. 15:13). He has provided His word to guide us as to how the "hope" of eternal life can become reality for each one of us (Romans 15:4). "In Christ" is where salvation is found (Romans 8:1). By being "baptized into Christ" (Romans 6:3; Galatians 3:27), we enter into a security that only God can provide.
