The Three Crosses of Calvary

We have made the statement many times and shall continue to make it, "If the cross of Christ does not break your heart, you will never be worth anything to the Lord and His church." It is not unusual today to find those who have never read the four accounts of the crucifixion, and, therefore, have no thought about the same. The four accounts are given in Matthew 27, Mark 15, Luke 23, and John 19, in your Bible. Hopefully, you will take the time to read these four chapters in order that you may have the full picture of Christ' execution. When John saw Jesus coming toward him one day, he said of Him, "Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world!" (Jn. I: 29). Jesus was the lamb of sacrifice who gave His life for our sin, when He became sin (the sin offering) for us (II Cor. 5:21). In His life on earth and suffering on the cross, "though he were rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, that ye through his poverty might be rich" (II Cor. 8:9). But do we realize that there were three crosses on Golgotha that day? Beginning at 9:00 a.m. that day, three individuals were crucified. Three different kinds of people were on those crosses. It will be noticed that there was the cross of rebellion, the cross of repentance, and the cross of redemption! On the cross of redemption, the Savior of the world hung in mortal agony with blood dripping from His head, His hands, His feet, and finally His side. The smell of death was in the air, and He was soon to say "It is finished" and die. His cross has the power to save man," For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." (I Cor. 1:18). On this cross Satan was defeated, as predicted in Genesis 3:15, and God's great love in giving His only begotten Son is demonstrated. Then we notice the cross of repentance. Both thieves hanging beside Jesus, to make it appear that Jesus deserved to die, spoke blasphemous words toward our Lord, but one later repented (Mk. 15:32). He had a change of heart. We do not know how he knew what he did about the coming kingdom of Christ, nor how he knew that Christ's death would not hinder the building of His church (Matt.16:18-19), unless he had been taught and baptized by John (Mk. 1:5). He did rebuke the other thief, and requested of Jesus "remember me when thou comest into thy kingdom" (Lk. 23:42). This thief was saved (Lk. 23:43). But there is also the third cross, the cross of rebellion. Very little has been said about this thief, but he no doubt represents the majority of humanity! We need to examine his case to see if he may represent us! Too many, like this man, doubt the Son of God, refuse to obey the Gospel in faith, repentance, confession, and baptism, and ignore the power of God to save by means of John 14:6 the cross.

Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.
