A good Christian is versatile by learning to talk and reason with people of various backgrounds. (Acts 17: 22-23) (1 Pe 3: 15)

Simple, not a high maintenance person who constantly needs his/her ego stroked or his/her anger assuaged. (Php 4:5) Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand (2 Cor 10:1) (Eph 4:26) (Js 1: 19-20)

Durable A Christian does not need new "heads" or "handles" but does have to pick up a cross daily, (Lk 9: 23) and endures all things to the end. (Js 1:12) (2 Tim 2:12)

Interactive He/she learns, works, and loves with others on many levels. There are dozens of "one another" verses in the letters to the early churches that still apply to us. (2 Jo 1:5) (Col 3:13) bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you.

Facilitator A good Christian learns to bring brethren with similar or even dissimilar personalities into closer harmony and love. (Php 4: 2-3) (2 Cor 13: 11) We all hope to be a hammer that God would be happy to have in his eternal home.
