Take Me To Your Leader!

In the old cartoons, the little green man from Mars crawled out of his UFO and said in his monotone voice, "Take me to your leader!" A reasonable request from a space alien, don't you think? The New Testament uses the term "alien" to describe people outside of Christ. They are "alienated from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them" (Ephesians 4:18). What greater favor could we do for them than to take them to our Leader? Isaiah foresaw a church that would be actively inviting people to learn from the Leader, saying "Come, and let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob. He will teach us His ways, and we shall walk in His paths" (Isaiah 2:3). Jesus' disciples brought people to their Leader even during His earthly ministry. Andrew "found his own brother, Simon, and said to him, 'We have found the Messiah,' (which is translated the Christ). And he brought him to Jesus" (John 1:41-42). Likewise Matthew, when Jesus had called him, hosted many other tax collectors in his home to meet Jesus (Matthew 9:9-10). We must remember that our goal is not to make a name for ourselves, but to bring people to Jesus. Paul corrected the Corinthians who had formed divisions based on human personalities. "Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul?" (1 Corinthians 1:13). Jesus was moved with compassion for the multitude "because they were like sheep not having a shepherd" (Mark 6:34). Let us demonstrate that same compassion by introducing them to our Leader, the Good Shepherd!

John 14:6 Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

1. Some say, "What difference does it make whether we believe the Bible or not?" But, the answer to this question determines the

- destiny of man for all time and eternity. Psalms 9:17 says, 'The wicked shall be cast into hell and all nations that forget God." Prov. 14:34 declares, "Righteousness exalteth a nation, but sin is a reproach to any people."
- 2. The Bible teaches that we live after death! - 5. We believe the Bible because we have been taught it. True indeed we should believe anything simply, merely and only because we have been taught to do so, BUT unless there is sufficient and good reason, we should NOT give up any good thing we have learned! AND no man has yet found sufficient reason for giving up his faith in God, Christ and the Bible!
- 6. We find some strong reason for believing the Bible because it has been accepted as the word of the Living God by some of the greatest scientists, philosophers, educators, scholars and the best men of all ages.

A Simple G-O-S-P-E-L

For some people, the thought of teaching someone else the gospel is fearful and even paralyzing. First of all, how do I get someone to agree to let me talk to them about the gospel, and then, if they agree, what do I even say? While teaching the gospel is certainly a task to be taken seriously and with proper readiness, it is something that every single Christian has both the ability and the knowledge to do. With prayer and trust in the Father above, a healthy level of confidence can be added to one's ability and knowledge to fulfill this exciting and rewarding responsibility of God's children.

So, what is an easy way to teach someone the G-O-S-P-E-L? Well, if I can remember how to spell G-O-S-P-E-L, then I have a simple way to tell someone the greatest news on earth. Let's teach together.

- **G—Goodness of God.** It is possible for anyone to "see that the Lord is good" (Psa. 34:8), for "the earth is full of [His] goodness" (33:5). He "made the world and everything in it," and "He gives to all life, breath, and all things...for in Him we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17:24-28). His goodness is seen in "His indescribable gift" (2 Cor. 9:15)!
- O—Openness to All. The greatness of God's love for "the world" is seen in that Jesus "died for all" (2 Cor. 5:14; cf. Heb. 2:9). "Without partiality" (1 Pet. 1:17), God "desires all men to be saved" (1 Tim. 2:4), and thus He calls "all" to Himself through the gospel (Mark 16:15; Matt. 11:28).
- S—Salvation Through Christ. Complete forgiveness of sins comes through (and only through) the death of Jesus on the cross (Gal. 1:4) and the shedding of His blood for us (Heb. 9:22; Rev. 1:5). By His authority (Matt. 28:18), His Word tells us exactly how to be saved from sin (Jas. 1:21; John 8:32).
- **P—Place of the Church.** It is important for everyone to know that the Lord has situated His church as an essential part of His plan (Eph. 3:10-11) and of our salvation (Acts 2:38-47). One cannot be saved outside of His church (Eph. 5:23) nor be delivered to heaven outside of it (1 Cor. 15:24).
- **E—Expectations of God.** The grace of God is extended to those who, "through faith" in Christ (Eph. 2:8), "obey Him" (Heb. 5:9) and "do the will" of the Father in heaven (Matt. 7:21). The one who "repents" and "is baptized" is "saved" from sin (Acts 2:38; Mark 16:16).
- L—Love's Response to God. When one finds out about God, about Jesus, about what they have done for us and about what they expect of us, the "love" filled response is one that will "keep His commandments" (1 John 5:3; John 14:15), without personal hesitation, suspicion or alteration. The gospel is not about "have-to's" but about "get-to's"!
