

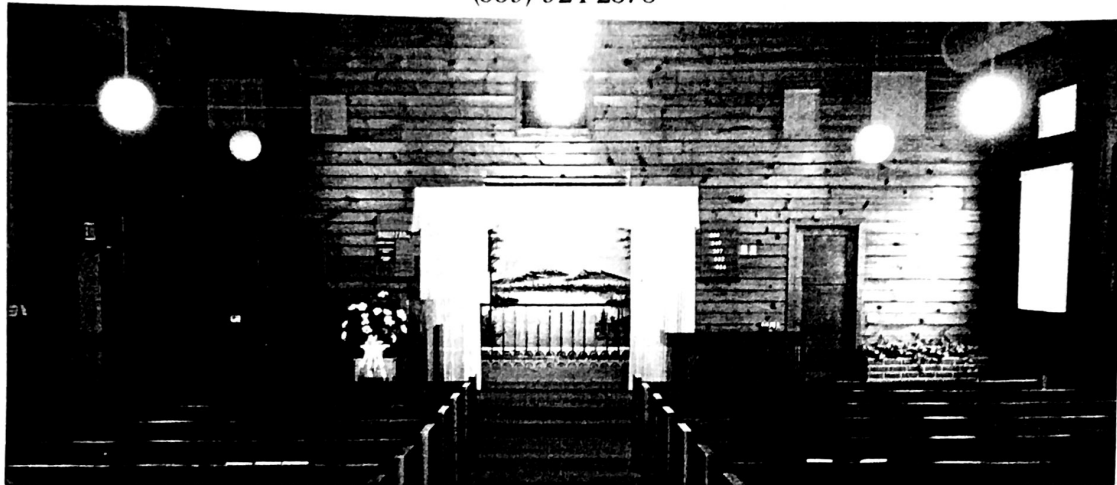

Galations 4:6

7 THINGS THAT WILL HELP YOU GROW SPIRITUALLY

1 – live and work to reach someone every day. If you knew the world would end tomorrow and Christ was to come back, is there a person(s) that you would urgently encourage to get “right with God?” (11 Peter 3:1-12).

2 – Be as Enthusiastic about the church, worship, teaching, and serving as you can. We don’t need an overflowing crowd to feel that way. Remember, we are serving the “KING” Your enthusiasm can be seen in those around you.

3 – Count your BLESSINGS. Make a list and “check it twice” about all the things God has done for you and for which you are thankful. Think about them as you pray, that will help you to be thankful (Philippians 4:6). It also helps us to realize our dependence on God (Acts 17:24-25, 28; John 15:5).

4 - This is a hard one..Make and maintain a list of your faults. Pray for forgiveness and ask for help in overcoming them. That helps me see that I’m not as good as I’d like to think I am and how much I really need a SAVIOR! It also helps me sympathize with the faults of others (James 5:16; Galatians 6:1).

5 – Keep a Quiet Time. Set aside a few minutes each day (say 20 or 30 minutes) to pray, read, or meditate. When you love people, you want to spend time with them. When you love God you want to spend time with Him...alone with Him (Psalms 1:2; 1 Thess. 5:17; Luke 18:1). In the first century many Christians kept an hour of prayer.

6 – Visit someone for Christ each week. Go to someone in the congregation you don’t know very well. Visit a sick person, visit a person who have come to the congregation as a visitor. Does someone need encouragement? Visit them!

7 – Reach Another Person (RAP) I’m not a “RAP” person, nor do I like “Hip Hop.” BUT..remember “RAP”. Invite someone in to you house for a Bible Study. Invite friends and relatives to study. Brandon or one of the elders would be glad to join in the teaching of anyone! There are 168 hours a week. If you were to attend Sunday morning Bible Study, Sunday morning Worship, Sunday evening Worship, Wednesday night classes, spend 30 minutes a day in Bible Study and prayer, and study with one person for one hour a month, that would only be about 7.5 hours a week. That would leave you 160.5 hours a week to do what you wanted to do. And since you would only teach a one hour Bible study with someone once a month, the other weeks when you didn’t have a class would allow you 161.5 hours to do as you please.

We are always happier when we have a PLAN. So start making plans to be happier this coming 2016.
