

Just Say "Yes"

A few of weeks ago, Mrs. Nancy Reagan died, and the country celebrated her life. She was an actress and the First Lady of one of the most significant Presidents in the history of the United States. As First Lady in the 1980s, she saw the problem of drugs that was like a cancer in the American culture. She and her advisors decided that she wanted to be known for, first, her devotion to her husband; and second, she wanted her term as a First Lady to be for something good for society. She chose the war against drugs. Her campaign was called, "Just Say No to Drugs." It seemed like a fine idea. How successful it was is debatable. The problem is, just saying "No" to something creates a vacuum, and nature abhors a vacuum. Her campaign was not meant to tell us what to fill that vacuum up with, but to just say "No." In that, I believed it failed. Because when you have a vacuum, when something is swept out of your life, the void will be filled with something else.

"When an evil spirit comes out of a man, it goes through arid places seeking rest and does not find it. Then it says, 'I will return to the house I left.' When it arrives, it finds the house unoccupied, swept clean, and put in order. Then it goes and takes with it seven other spirits more wicked than itself, and they go in and live there. And the final condition of that man is worse than the first. This is how it will be with this wicked generation," (Matthew 12:43-45, NIV1984)

For 2,000 years, the church has taught us to just say "No" to sin. But God's Word tells us how to fill the vacuum that's left. God provides a "Yes." Just saying "No," or "Don't" to sin, is totally inadequate and is bound to fail. What must happen is saying "No" to sin and "Yes" to Christ. "Yes"—to Christ to fill up my life; to let him teach me how to love like Him; how to submit to His will; how to commit everything to Him; and to act on this to share it with others. Christ is telling us to say "No" to sin, and "Yes" to grace. Through the blood of Christ, grace will forgive us of our sins. Saying "Yes" to Christ allows Him to forgive our sins; but only if you say, not just "No" to sin, but "Yes" to Christ who wants to dwell in our hearts.

"I pray that out of his glorious riches, he may strengthen you with power through His Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the saints, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love of Christ that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God. Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine according to his power that is at work within us, to Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever! Amen." (Ephesians 3:16-21, NIV1984)

Let's say "No" to sin and "Yes" to filling our lives with Christ.
