

Some important facts about baptism - Part I

We are living in a time when people even within our fellowship have stated doubts about baptism and its relavence. Let me tell you what the Bible sayhs about it.

Baptism is a burial (Romans 6:4; Col. 2:12) it consists of a process of immersion of submersion. To do that, you must have water, much water (John 3:23) so a person can be buried/put under the water. Now why, so we can die....to sin, and that sinful old man remains in the grave. Sprinkling or pouring is not baptism.

Baptism is for those old enough to hear, believe, repent, and confess (Acts 2:37-28; 8:37). Children and those who are not mentally competent are safe. They are not accountable to God. In Ezekiel 28:15 "You were perfect in your ways from the day that you were created, till sin was found in you." So there is a time before we accountable for our sins. Philip asked the Ethiopian Treasurer...."do you understand what you read?" (Acts 8:30). So a person needs to understand before believing and repenting is necessary.

Baptism is commanded. Read Mark 16:15-16; Acts 2:38; Acts 10:48. After reading those passages you realize that a command is not a suggestion....it is a command and MUST be obeyed. Many treat baptism as if it an option...not true. In the same breath, Peter commanded repentance and baptism. (Part II next week)

A Prior Engagement - James A. Garfield, the 20th President of the United States, took office on March 4, 1881. On his first Sunday in Washington, following his inauguration, a member of the Cabinet insisted that a meeting must be called to discuss a matter that purportedly threatened a national crisis. The President refused, stating that he was already committed to another appointment. The Cabinet member insisted, telling the President that the national matter was of grave importance and that he should break his prior engagement. Still, Mr. Garfield refused to do so.

Obviously appalled, the Cabinet member remarked, "I would be interested to know with whom you have an engagement so important that it cannot be broken." Mr. Garfield replied, "I will be as frank as you are. My engagement is with the Lord, to meet Him at His house, at His table, at 10:00 o'clock tomorrow morning, and I shall be there."

What an example! May we, too, be so dedicated to the worship of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, that we shall not forget we have a standing "Prior Engagement" every Sunday morning.

IN THE SHADOW OF THE CROSS



This is one of the most difficult things to understand. Even before Jesus was born, God planned to send His Son to die on the cross.

One of the most graphic passages about the death of Jesus on the cross was written before Jesus was born. It's found in Psalms 22.

Psalms 22:1 predicts one of the seven things Jesus said on the cross when he said, "My God, My God why has thou forsaken me?" And Psalms 22:14-16 predicts how Jesus hands and feet would be nailed to the cross and how the Romans would divide his clothing and cast lots for his robe. 22:14-15 tells us how Jesus would feel ~ with his bones out of joint, the heart exploding in his chest, and the horrible thirst that occurs at crucifixion.

Isaiah predicted the crucifixion of Jesus too. Isaiah 53:5 says that Jesus would be wounded for OUR transgressions, he would be bruised for our iniquities. The passage also tells us that by his wounds we are healed.

These are just two of the many Old Testament prophecies about the cross of Jesus. But Peter makes a startling revelation in I Peter 1:18-20. Here, Peter tells us we have been ransomed – our sins have been forgiven – by the blood of Jesus dying on the cross. And that Jesus had been destined to make this sacrifice "before the foundation of the world."

Before God made man, before God made the earth, He knew that we would fall short of His glory because of our sins. So, before the world was made, God the Father destined Jesus to die on the cross.

Before the birth of the earth, there was behind Jesus ~ the shadow of the cross.
