Focusing on Hope

He continually reinforces this theme in the first 12 verses. By reiterating a few of the blessings promised by a faithful God, Peter prompts believers to focus on the hope that is part and parcel of a right relationship with Him: their election and sanctification through the sprinkling of the blood of Jesus. 1 Peter 1:2.

To bolster his assertion, Peter lists the following blessings encompassed in a right relationship with God:

Believers are reborn to a living hope— 1 Peter 1:3

Believers have the hope of an incorruptible inheritance waiting for them in heaven— 1 Peter 1:4

Believers are comforted by the hope in the power of God's eternal salvation— 1 Peter 1:5 Believers have great inexpressible joy in the fullness of God's glory— 1 Peter 1:6-9

Reviewing the blessings associated with Christ, Peter urges believers to prepare for the hardships that Christians face as part of their walk with Christ. Rather than focusing on adversity, Peter directs His readers to fix their minds on the hope they have in Christ:

"Therefore, prepare your minds for action; keep sober in spirit, fix your hope completely on the grace to be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ," 1 Peter 1:13.

Today, we appreciate and understand the relevance of Peter's epistle regarding a right relationship with Christ. He steadfastly encourages fellow believers to turn away from any and all things that impede focusing on the hope embedded in a spiritual relationship. He urges believers to put away the impediments of fear, worry, or preoccupation with carnal

possessions. Instead, replace obstacles with a hope that rests wholly in the grace we will receive when Christ comes again.
