

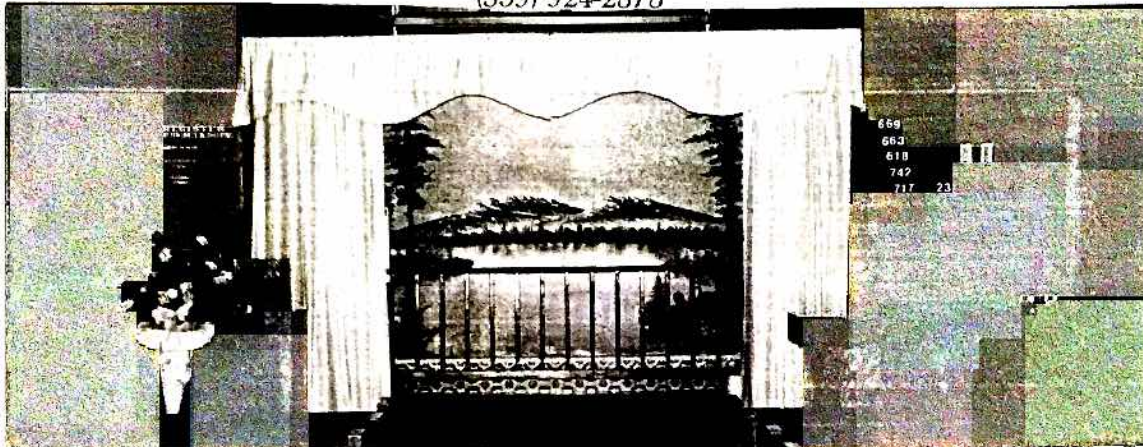

Come and See

In the beginning of Christ's earthly ministry it started with a simple invitation, "*Come and see.*" In our American culture, we seem to be more private than ever before, personal evangelism seems to be hurting, people fear telling of Jesus or "telling their story." It would really be wonderful if someone would come up with a clear cut 100% winner of a technique to evangelize.

I Cor. 3:6 reminds us that teaching and evangelism is often a team effort....Paul planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the increase. How do we plant? By inviting someone to "*come and see.*" When they heard the teaching of John the Baptist, Andrew and Philip followed Jesus. They asked where he was staying - he said "*come and you will see.*" They followed, spent the day with him, and then Andrew went to his brother and said, "*We have found the Messiah.*" When Jesus saw the brother of Andrew (Simon) he said to him, "*You are Simon, son of John. You will be called Cephus (which when translated, is Peter).*" Then Philip went out and found Nathanael, telling him, "*We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law, and about whom the prophets wrote - Jesus of Nazareth! Can anything good come from there? Nathanael asked. 'Come and see,' said Philip.*" The great Apostle Peter followed the "come and see" invitation (read John 1:35-46 for the whole story). You can evangelize with a simple, "Come and see!"

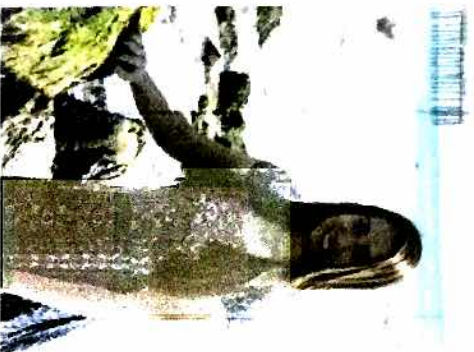

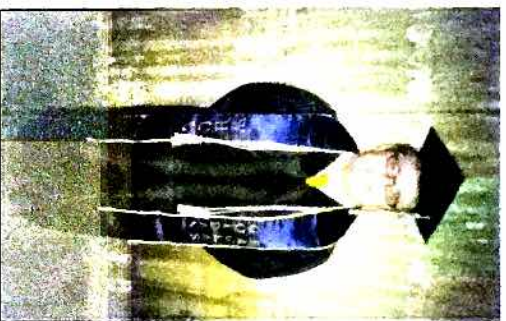

Do you dare Imagine, can you Imagine?

"By this the love of God was manifested in us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world so that we might live through Him. In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His only begotten Son to be a propitiation for our sins." 1 John 4:9-10

There are a lot of things beyond my imagination. My life would be different without Shirley, Vincent, Elizabeth and our grandchildren, Libbie and Brock. I can't imagine what my life would be if they had never existed. I can't imagine what life would be without you, my friends and spiritual family. If I had been born in another part of the world, torn by strife and war, I might be dead by this time. I can't imagine living in a different era or part of the world.

While there are many things hard to imagine not being there, there is one thing that is forever the same. The world as touched by Jesus Christ. Can you imagine a world untouched by Jesus? Can you imagine how radically our world would be without the Love of God?

If there were no "Jesus influence" what we can't imagine would be commonplace! The concepts of freedom, of rights, of morality, of justice would change....not only at the concept level but the application level as well. Evil would become good, wrong would become right, and we would exist to be used and discarded.

"OK preacher, why would you think that?" Think about the context of our world: as God's influence through Jesus decreases anywhere, the evil treatment of people increases. When good leaves, there is a vacuum and evil very quickly fills the hole.

Our world is not perfect. Jesus' influence is often exploited and abused. Many people are shocked by the behavior of some who claim to be Christians. Situations should improve. BUT...the understanding of what God does through Jesus, the faith we have in God, the abundant life, the trustworthiness of God's promises, the fact that God gives people value, how behavior is transformed, the proper value of human life....helps people to understand how much Jesus changes people.

Can you imagine Christian influence existing without my support, commitment, and prayers? Can you...do you dare imagine the world without the influence of our Lord and our undying support of that influence. Support, Commitment, and prayers for HIS influence, It's our choice.
