Beware of False Teachers



Most teachers and preachers look alike. I'm not sure you can tell the difference between a good one and a bad one just by looking. I'm not sure you can tell the difference between a false teacher and a true teacher by sight. But Jesus wanted us to see a difference. If not by sight, then how do you tell the difference?

Jesus warned us of false teachers in Matthew 7:15, "Beware of False Prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravenous wolves." In other words, they appear to be godly but they're not. When The Apostle Paul spoke of Satan, he gave him special ability. Notice, "For Satan himself transforms himself into an angel of light" (II Cor. 11:14). What makes false teachers so dangerous is that they appear to be righteous. John said, "For many false prophets have gone out into the world" (I John 4:11). Let's see...false teachers...false doctrines. No wonder it's hard for people to know what's true and what's not. One of the warnings given by the Apostle Paul is this, "Also from among yourselves men will rise up, speaking perverse things, do draw away the disciples after themselves" (Acts 20:30). It that true today? Sure, why not? Peter warned, "there will be false prophets among you, who will secretly bring destructive heresies" (II Pet. 2:1). Secretly, so that people aren't really aware of what's happening. The result of that is that people can and will be lost because they believe the wrong thing.

How do false teachers spread false doctrine? Romans 16:18 says, "By smooth words and flattering speech deceive the hearts of the simple." You wouldn't expect someone to be so bold as to say...."now folks, this isn't what the Bible teaches but it's what I believe!" II Peter 2:3 tells us they use "deceptive words." You and I have to be aware of what the Bible teaches, or else we'll be "tossed to and fro and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men in the cunning craftiness of deceitful plotting" (Ephesians 4:14).

We are warned, "Do not be carried about with various and strange doctrines" (Hebrews 13:9). Why? We've got a reward coming if we are faithful and true to God and his Word. In Colossians Paul warns, "Let no one cheat you of your reward." Losing something physical and losing our souls are two different things.

How do we deal with those who promote false teaching? II John 2:10-1 says, "If anyone comes to you and does not bring this doctrine (what is spoken or written in the New Testament), do not receive him into your house nor bid him God speed; for he that bids him God speed is partaker of his evil deeds." This isn't talking about being friends with someone who believes differently than the Bible...it means giving him encouragement in the false teaching. Timothy was told that "the Holy Scriptures are able to make you wise unto salvation" (II Timothy 3:15). If that's true then perverting the "Holy Scriptures" can keep one from salvation.

I don't want to set myself up as the standard. I'm a man...human....frail....and weak. I want a standard that is not from men. I want a standard from God. The Bible is that standard and we can't let men change or pervert it if it is vital for our salvation.
