The Specifics:

- My version of the Seven Laws of Teaching:
- 1) Know what you are going to teach. Your mind needs to be full and clear to accomplish the task at hand.
- 2) Gain and maintain the attention of those who are your students. Refuse to teach without their attention.
- 3) Speak to your students in a way that they will understand. Be clear and vivid in what you mean to say.
- 4) Proceed from what the students know to that which they do not know. Let that which is known lead them to that which is unknown. Use precise means to accomplish this.
- 5) Use the mind of the student. Allow the student to discover the knew knowledge or understanding ahead of them.
- 6) Make the students reproduce the which has been learned. Let them find the language to put the knew information in their own words.
- 7) Review! Connect what you have learned in past lessons to what is being learned here.

 - Need to be kind
- The Teaching
 - Need to Prepare
 - Need to Plan
 - Need to Review
